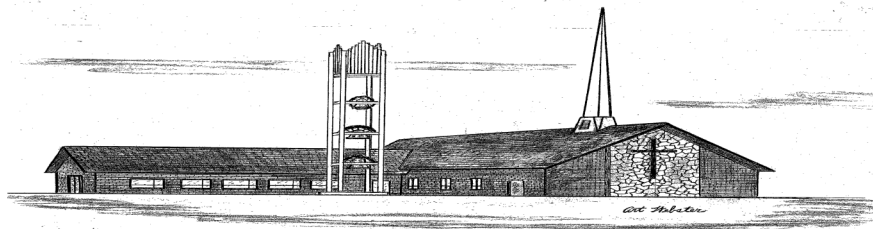

A Christmas Carol

Dear Friends in Christ,

For many people, an annual Christmas tradition is to watch a version of Charles Dickens, “A Christmas Carol”. And there’s many versions to choose from. Since 1910, nearly 95 different actors have played Ebenezer Scrooge in one form or another. That’s nearly one movie or TV show done every year since people started watching “moving pictures”. It’s very popular indeed.

Most of us know the basics of the story, Scrooge is a lonely, miserly, old man. However, on Christmas Eve, Scrooge is visited by three spirits. These spirits, the ghosts of Christmas Past, Present and Future, take Scrooge on a journey, revisiting Christmases throughout his life.

While we know the story, most of us don’t realize what a wide influence A Christmas Carol has had on our culture. Phrases like, “Merry Christmas” and “Bah! Humbug!” were popularized by this work. A miserly person became known as a “Scrooge.” And according to one historian, even the current way we observe Christmas is largely the result of a revival of the holiday began by this book.

As people stopped going to church during the late 18th and 19th centuries, Dickens’ created a story of a “self-centered” festival of generosity. Instead of gathering to celebrate the birth of Christ, families gathered around seasonal food and drink, dancing, games, and the theme of “generosity of spirit”. No longer was it important that Christ came, but how you treated your fellow man. In other words, your redemption is dependent on your good works and not on what Jesus did for you.

I think this can be shown in one small scene that the Ghost of Christmas Present shows Scrooge. In the Cratchit household, as the family prepares for their Christmas celebration, Bob Cratchit and his son Tiny Tim return to the house. When asked how Tim behaved, this is the reply: “As good as gold,” said Bob, “and better. Somehow he gets thoughtful sitting by himself so much, and thinks the strangest things you ever heard. He told me, coming home, that he hoped the people saw him in the church, because he was a cripple, and it might be pleasant to them to remember upon Christmas Day, who made lame beggars walk, and blind men see.”

How is this strange? Christmas is about the one who made lame beggars walk and blind men see. Christmas is about the Son of God who became Immanuel – “Christ with us”. Christmas is about the Word becoming flesh and dwelling among us, Christmas. Christmas is about our Lord and Savior, coming into this world to save us from our sins, to restore us to a right relationship with God.

Dickens wrote a tale where a life is transformed by the guilt and remorse that one feels confronted by the horrors of this world. But the true **Christmas Carol** is about the one born of the Virgin Mary, the infant who would be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. The true **Christmas Carol** is about the one who came to free us from our sins, who transforms are lives by His grace and mercy. It is only through Christ that we can have the transformed lives that Scrooge experiences in this tale.

And because Christ came, we can echo what Bob Cratchit and Tiny Tim say, “A Merry Christmas to us all, God bless us.” “God bless us every one!”

Dear Prince of Peace Lutheran Church

Finances are a daunting part of this journey, yet God has given my wife and me peace in being here, a portion of which is from people's support—Christ's body working together.
