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## October is Reformation Month

Dear Friends in Christ,

With the coming of October, we enter more deeply into the routines of fall. For some it is the football season – Friday nights, Saturdays, Sundays, and Monday nights. For others, it's the return of Penguins on ice. Hunters prepare for their seasons. Homeowners dig out the rakes. And at the end of the month, Halloween causes its share of enthusiasm and excitement as well.

Hidden in the midst of all this is the remembrance of the Reformation. Unless you're Lutheran, it may be overlooked completely. And yet, the Reformation is a very significant event that started 499 years ago when Martin Luther nailed the 95 theses to the door of Wittenberg Church. This call for a debate on the nature of repentance, indulgences and the life of a Christian resulted in changes that would forever alter Western Christianity as well as Western Civilization. Life Magazine, at the end of the twentieth century, listed the most influential people of the last 1,000 years. Martin Luther came in third.

Martin Luther entered the monastery as one feeling condemned by God. He spent much time, up to 8 hours some days, confessing his sin in hopes God would be gracious and merciful. Luther's many and continual questions about God, led his superior to send him to the university where he could study and teach and maybe thereby, come to some conclusions on his own about his questions. Luther spent much time learning Hebrew, Aramaic and Greek in order to read the Bible in the original languages. His studies quest led him to the conviction that current teachings in the church were not supported by God's Word in the Bible. It was Luther's study of the Scriptures that stirred up a storm in him that the church was wrong. When he was challenged to take back (retract/recant) the accusations that he was leveling at his church, he replied "**Unless I am convinced by proofs from Scriptures or by plain and clear reasons and arguments, I can and will not retract, for it is neither safe nor wise to do anything against conscience. Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me. Amen.**"

Luther and the other Reformers became convinced that it was the Word of God and the Word of God alone that was the source and rule for all doctrine. This became known as Scripture Alone (Sola Scriptura). We do not worship the Scriptures but rather see it as God's revelation of Salvation by Grace through Faith in His Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

As we study the Word of God, the Holy Spirit transforms us into the image of Christ. By the means of grace, the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, nourishing our faith so that it does not die. And so we stand holy before our God and Father. Scriptures are useful for correction and teaching the way of discipleship in following Jesus. They aid us in discerning the path of Life versus the ways of the world which lead to death. Studying the Scriptures is a way that we come to have the mind of Christ. Studying the Scriptures should be as much a part of life for a Christian as breathing is.

Luther's study of the Scriptures is what gave rise to the Reformation. We will do well today to respect and honor this written Word which acquaints us with Jesus, his life, death and resurrection. We will do well to pay special attention to it today, when the culture pulls and tugs at concerning "other" ways to live. It is the source of our confidence of faith and trust in God's marvelous forgiving grace and his eternal life. As we begin the countdown to the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation, I encourage you to break open that Word, spend the next year reading the entire Bible. In it, you will discover a gracious and merciful God. Through it, He will reform your life also.

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## Generosity in Your Own Words

How did you learn about being generous? Was it your parents who taught you or did you learn it by experience? Did you know that generosity is a gift from the Holy Spirit?

The Apostle Paul references it in his epistle to the Romans, chapter 12.<sup>1</sup> He dictates these words from God, starting with verse 6. *"Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them."* Verse 7c informs us that *"the one who contributes, should do so in generosity."*

Generosity is a gift of the Spirit of God and we are to practice it. Whether you learned from a model or not, generosity is a gift that God gives to His Church for our own good and for the good of others.

However you express your generosity, if you had to put it into words, what would you write or say? What would you tell others?

Actions of generosity often speak for themselves. There is another gift that is associated with generosity. In Romans 12:8a, God's Word tells us about the benefit of exhortation (encouragement) in generosity. Putting generosity in your own words helps accomplish this encouragement that often, if not always, precedes God's gift of generosity in others.

Have you talked with your family or friends about generosity? This is not to suggest that you brag about it but rather that you *'encourage'* or *'exhort'* those under your care or influence to hear your own witness.
