In Defense of Our Faith

Dear Friends in Christ,

It happens every year like clockwork. As we enter into the Easter season, a television program, a new book, some professor at some prestigious university will promote a new theory on why our faith cannot possibly be true. Recently, we heard how "scholars" found the family tomb of Jesus, with the remains of Mary and Joseph, Jesus' wife and children. This contradicts the theory that Jesus and his family left Israel and move to what is now France, their family eventually becoming the royal family there.

Of course, this kind of story-telling has been going on since the chief priest paid the Roman soldiers to say that the disciples came by night and stole the body of Jesus away (Matt. 28:11-15)

This month, I'd like to share with you a very positive story I recently read on how some dealt with attacks on the Christian faith.

In 1930, Nikolai Bukharian, one of the leaders of the communist party in Russia, traveled from Moscow to Kiev to address a large gathering on atheism. "Addressing the crowd he aimed his verbal assault at Christianity, hurling one insult after another, offering arguments and proof against those foolish enough to profess faith in such a myth. This went on for an hour. When he finished his assault not only against Christians but Christ himself, he looked out at what seemed to be the smoldering ashes of men's faith in front of him and sneeringly asked, 'Are there any questions?' A deafening silence filled the room. Then, just before the long silence was ready to declare atheism the winner, one man meekly walked to the platform and stood up to the podium next to the communist leader. He looked out over the crowd, first looking to the left and then to the right. Then he shouted the well-known and well loved greeting within the Russian Orthodox Church, 'CHRIST IS RISEN!' His confession of faith broke the silence within the hearts of the faithful. What followed silenced Bukharin. The whole auditorium rose to its feet and as one voice shouted, 'HE IS RISEN INDEED!'"

Scripture says that when we are confronted by those who challenge our faith we should "Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect," (1Pe 3:14-15 ESV)

Often we overly complicate what is means to "make a defense" of our faith. We believe we need to know every little detail, to understand every theological point, to have all the Scriptures memorized in order to make a defense against the falsehoods and heresies that are brought against the faith. But in reality, all we have to do is be willing to confess what has been taught by the church since our Lord founded it. The hope we have in eternal life, the hope we have in salvation from the sins of this world is placed in the resurrection of our Lord. And so we can boldly say, "HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!"

April 22 —"Repentance Refreshment"



The Holy Spirit – The Lutheran Difference

"Are you filled with the Holy Spirit?"

"Sure ... well, aren't all Christians filled with the Holy Spirit?"

As Lutherans interact with other Christians, they often find themselves struggling to explain their beliefs and practices. Although many Lutherans have learned the "what" of the doctrines of the church, they do not always have a full scriptural foundation to share the "why." When confronted with different doctrines they cannot clearly state their faith, much less understand the differences.

Because of insecurities about explaining particular doctrines or practices, some Lutherans may avoid opportunities to share what they have learned from Christ and His Word. The Lutheran Difference Bible study series will identify how Lutherans differ from other Christians and show from the Bible why Lutherans differ. These studies will prepare Lutherans to share their faith and help non-Lutherans understand the Lutheran difference.
