

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Happy New Year! No, I haven't completely lost my mind. (I know it's around here somewhere.) If you grew up in the church, you know that on Nov. 29 we begin a new church year with the season of <u>Advent</u>. Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas which we celebrate on Dec. 25 and the celebration continues until Epiphany on Jan. 6, 2016. In contrast to the world around us, where "Prepare the Way" means shopping, decorating, and baking, the focus of Advent is two-fold. On the one hand we <u>prepare</u> to celebrate the <u>birth</u> of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who came into the world as both God and man so that our sins might be forgiven. On the other hand, we <u>anticipate</u> the day when Jesus will <u>return</u> to the earth to bring an end to this world. Those will be scary days, but we can look forward to the end of the world with <u>confidence</u> because, by faith in Jesus, the <u>end</u> of this world will mean the <u>beginning</u> of a <u>new life</u> with Christ for <u>eternity</u>. Therefore, during Advent we repent of our sins and believe they are forgiven for the sake of Christ's death and resurrection.

To <u>help</u> us prepare for His coming (first and second) we will have **midweek services** on Wed. evenings at 7 p.m. **Dec. 2, 9, & 16**. We also would like to make available some daily Advent <u>devotions</u>. Lutheran Hour Ministries has been preparing them for years, but a few years ago they stopped printing them. Just as they seized the opportunity to reach out with the Gospel via radio in the 1920's, now they are reaching out via the <u>internet</u>. You can sign up at **Ihm.org** to have an Advent devotion sent to you <u>daily</u> via <u>e-mail</u>, OR we can download a master copy and print it in the church office for you to pick up. Here is the description from the LHM website.



#### Advent Devotions from LHM Now Available for Download

How often do you face your day with a sense of fear and dread? Holiday seasons like Thanksgiving and Christmas can easily lose their joy and delight when little things relentlessly nag at us and annoy us. Maybe the busy preparations of the season have you down, or perhaps you are reeling from a major life crisis or catastrophe.

Addressing this unsettling seasonal phenomenon will be *Fear Not!*, the 2015 Advent devotions written by Lutheran Hour Ministries' Theological Editor and Writer Rev. Wayne Palmer. These thought-provoking meditations will study the events of our Savior's birth as recorded in the first two chapters of the Gospel of Luke and remind us that God is the One fully in charge, reigning beyond our circumstances, granting us the daily grace to trust in Him, even when life clouds our vision.

Fear Not! is now live at <a href="www.adventdevotions.net">www.adventdevotions.net</a>. Here you can find the downloadable version, which includes a large-font text, bulletin inserts, bulletin shells, and PowerPoint slides. Audio availability begins November 29. Fear Not! will also be available as an e-mail subscription throughout the Advent season. A Spanish offering for Advent, En la tierra paz (Peace on Earth) by Rev. Dr. Sergio Schelske from Buenos Aires, Argentina, will be available soon.
