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## Dear Friends in Christ,

You may not realize it, but Christianity is a "historical" faith. By this I mean that our faith is rooted in people and events that actually happened, that can be proven by historical accounts. The life of Jesus Christ is recorded by four separate writers in the Bible, which is three more sources than we have for people like Julius Caesar or Socrates. Not only do we have the Biblical accounts, but there are non-biblical accounts as well, that speak of the man Jesus who was crucified, and yet his tomb was empty.

We live just shy of 2,000 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. In some ways we are far removed from the historic life of Christ on this earth. But in other ways, through Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper, we are members of Christ's Church and are connected to those events. That historic story is our story as well and so it is wise that we study the history of the church. In that light, let's take a brief look at the history of the season we are about to enter, Lent.

History tells us that early preparations for the celebration of Easter included fasting from the end of the worship service on Good Friday to the celebration of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. In the generations that followed, the period of fasting was increased to all of Holy Week, during which those studying the principles of Christianity - catechumens would prepare for the reception of Holy Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

The length of preparation increased in time until, by the $7^{\text {th }}$ century, we reached the current forty day period for Lent. Since Sunday is the day of Resurrection, those days are skipped over and Lent begins on Ash Wednesday.

Why did the Church settle on a forty-day period? Well, it reminds of many things; Noah and the rain that fell for 40 days and nights, Moses and the Israelites spending 40 years in the wilderness, Elijah spending forty days and nights in the desert; Jonah giving the city of Nineveh forty days to repent, and of course Jesus himself fasted forty days in the wilderness after His baptism.

The season of Lent gives us the opportunity to prepare for the coming celebration of Easter. During this time we focus on fallen and sinful nature that required such a great sacrifice by Jesus on the cross. To help us do this, the language of Lent is quieted. We refrain from using alleluia as an expression of praise. Our music and songs are restrained. Even the liturgical color of the season, purple, is considered one of the more "quieter" colors as it is associated with penitence and sorrow. And while we change our music and our language, the focus of our faith is always on Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

Just as with our forefathers in the Church, Lent provides us a foundation to study the faith in preparation the great celebration of Easter. With that in mind, it is my hope that you will take advantage of the extra services that Prince of Peace provides in order to prepare.
