Growing Through Conflict

February 10 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the forty day penitential season of Lent that ends with Easter on March 27. It is early this year. Last year at Labor Day, we had no idea that I would still be serving you, but based on Pastor Michael's latest CaringBridge report, it appears that I will probably be here until Easter. So I need to make plans for Lent.

Since I've been trained to work with congregations in transition that sometimes also includes conflict, I have come to appreciate the ministry of "Ambassadors of Reconciliation," a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the LCMS. Since conflict is an issue that POP has experienced recently, I would like to share with you during this Lenten season some of the AoR resources that I've used to educate you in Biblical Peacemaking / Reconciliation. I will not be addressing any specific conflicts, but instead we will be learning some basic principles of human nature and how to address conflict in a God-pleasing way as taught in the Bible. What we learn will be a blessing in every facet of your lives.

Let me first tell you a little about the organization, founded by LCMS lay businessman, Ted Kober. Their website describes their ministry as follows: "Ambassadors of Reconciliation is an international ministry founded to equip Lutherans and their churches for living, proclaiming and cultivating lifestyles of reconciliation. Their theme verse is from 2 Corinthians:

"We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God."
(2 Corinthians 5:20)

Plans are still taking shape, but we are considering a slight shift in our Wednesday morning Bible study time, so that we can invite preschool parents or grandparents to meet with us. If you would like a little less conflict and a little more peace in your life, please make it a point to be with us every Sunday during Lent and, if possible, at the Bible study for more in depth discussion. If you can't make it during the day, let Wendy know and I will consider an evening study group as well. If you know someone else who has struggled with conflict in their lives (not just in church), invite them to come with you. We need to have an idea of how many people will participate, so that we can order bible study materials.

We will have the traditional major midweek worship services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday.
