True love is not rooted in our desires, in our wants, but comes from God. "God is love," (1Jo 4:8 ESV) John writes. God's love was made evident in this world when God sent His only Son into the world that we might live through Him. We are able to love because God first loved us.

Most of us know the biblical description of love from 1 Corinthians 13: "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1Co 13:4-8 ESV)

Not only does this explanation perfectly fit God's love toward us, it is an apt description of God Himself. Look what happens when we insert "God" in place of "Love": God is patient and kind; God does not envy or boast; He is not arrogant or rude.

And although there is only one way to Heaven, God does not insist on His own way, rather He grieves for all those who are lost. And this should be the way we love each other and God. Through our baptisms we have been recreated in the image of God. We should be patient and kind; we should not be envious or boastful; we should not be arrogant or rude. For the sake of our brothers and sisters here on earth, we should bear all things, believe all things, hope all things, and endure all things, for we know that in Christ, we will never end. This is what Jesus called us to do when He said, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Mar 12:31 ESV)

However, none of us have ever perfectly fulfilled this biblical definition of love.
