The founding pastor of the LCMS, Dr. C.F.W. Walther always emphasized the proper <u>balance</u> between the Clergy and what the Bible refers to as "the <u>priesthood</u> of <u>all believers</u>." That is you! You are all missionaries in this mission-field in which we live. It is no secret that the world around us is changing rapidly, and in many respects not in good ways. We all need to have a sense of urgency about reaching the lost, while there is still time.

As your "intentional interim associate pastor," if you so desire, I would be happy to <u>facilitate</u> a process of <u>mission</u> refocus and renewal in partnership with Pastor Michael. I will be discussing this with the Elders and Council this month. God willing, by the time of the newsletter for next month, He will provide some clearer direction for Pastor Michael and his family, and for us all.
