Psalms, Shepherds, Sheep

Dear Friends in Christ.

Martin Luther loved the Psalms. It was his daily prayer book as a monk, the first book of the Bible he lectured on as a professor, and a source of comfort and piety throughout his life. Luther believed that the Psalter ought to be a precious and beloved book to all Christians because "it promises Christ's death and resurrection so clearly and so depicts His kingdom and the condition and nature of all Christendom that we may call it a little Bible." Luther believed that if you could not read the whole Bible, the Psalter is good enough as that it is an entire summary of the Bible in one little booklet.

Psalm 23 was the Bible memory focus of this year's VBS. Every child, youth, and adult who participated this year learned that the Lord is with us now and forever, provides all that we need, and protects us. For those who were unable to attend this year, let's take a closer look at this psalm.

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want." The first verse of this psalm paints a beautiful picture of who God is. Shepherds do only one thing: they take care of sheep. They make sure they have food and drink. They stay with them every hour of every day, guiding them in the daytime and protecting them at night. When wolf or coyote or other predator appear, the shepherd fights against that animal, killing it so it cannot harm the sheep.

Throughout Scripture God says that He is a shepherd. He did it in Ezekiel 34 and in Isaiah 40. In the gospel according to John, Jesus calls Himself the Good Shepherd. When God calls Himself a shepherd, He is telling you that He wants to do only one thing: take care of you and me. Shepherds want their sheep to have good food and drink. That is why verse 2 of Psalm 23 says about God, "He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters." Shepherds stay with the sheep every hour protecting them. That is why verse 4 and 5 say, "He leads me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake. I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and your staff they comfort me." Shepherds give everything for their sheep. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, laid down His life for us so that we might have the forgiveness of sins.

Psalm 23 isn't just a picture of God, it's a picture of us too. We are the sheep. This psalm tells us how much we need the Shepherds protection, how rely on Him for our food and drink. Many other Bible pages refer to us as sheep; Isaiah said, "All we like sheep have gone astray." (Is 53.6) and through Ezekiel God says, "You are My sheep." (Eze. 34.31).

How wonderful it is that the Lord is our shepherd and we are His sheep. In Psalm 23, the Lord our Shepherd promises to lead us safely through every day of our lives, forgiving us, protecting us, and bringing us at last to our heavenly home. Psalm 23 ends with these words, "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever." (Ps. 23:6)

All in all, Psalm 23 is, as all the Psalms are, a wonderful and beautiful portrait that God has created for us. It is not made out of paints and pencils, but with His words – and God's words give forgiveness and life.

"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want."
