Excellent Time

Dear Friends in Christ,

There's a story of a group of explorers deep in the Amazon Jungle. They have lost their compass. Their maps are torn. And they ran out of batteries for the GPS months ago. One Saturday: 6:30 PM Worship day, one of the explorers addresses the group and says, "Well, we don't know where we are. We don't know where we are going. But the good news is, we're making excellent time."

The members of St. Peter's and Trinity had a purpose, a goal in mind many years ago; to serve the community of German immigrants here in the Freedom area, and to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ according to correct doctrine. But as those goals were reached, as the two congregations became one, we started to resemble those explorers in the Amazon: sometimes we don't know where we are, sometimes we don't know where we're going, but we were making excellent time.

In order to be good stewards of the God-given gifts that our church possesses, and to help us focus on where we need to be going, the church Council recently held a planning meeting. I'd like to share with you some of the results from this session.

A couple of the things that we discussed concerned where we're at. For example, Prince of Peace is a family friendly church that is open to new members. We do both contemporary and traditional music on a set schedule. We have a preschool. The members of this congregation, over the years, have said, "This is who we are. This is what we do."

In figuring out where we going, the council agreed that we need to be more inward than outward focused at the time being. What this means is that we will have more events, more opportunities to simple "be" together - to grow as a family. We will also have more chances to serve each other within the church. But most especially, we will make sure there are ample opportunities to grow in our faith, to learn the basic principles of God and the more mature doctrines as well.

Does this mean that we're going to forego all attempts to look outward beyond the bounds of our congregation - by no means! One on the items we focused on was how to integrate our preschool with the congregation and use it as an outreach tool. Prince of Peace will always be a welcoming place for newcomers. We're also looking at opportunities in community where we can serve together, such as through Hosanna Industries or other places.

So what can you do at this time? Two things: first, pray. Pray for the wisdom and guidance of God to fall upon the leaders of this church. Pray that we might know the Will of God. Pray for all of us at Prince of Peace, that we are not discouraged by this world, but encouraged through the Word of God.

The other thing, join us. Join us for VBS and clean-up days. Join us for Bible studies and worship. Join us when it's time to mourn and join us when it's time to laugh and sing and play. But come and participate with your brothers and sisters in Christ.

This is an excellent time for the Christian Church on earth. It is an exciting time. Never before have we had the tools and resources to educate ourselves and to share the good news of Jesus Christ. I look forward to what God brings to us.

Eight Reasons Why My Anxiety Is Pointless and Foolish

1. God is near me to help me.

<u>Philippians 4:5-6</u>: "The Lord is at hand; [therefore] do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

2. God cares for me.

1 Peter 5:7: ". . . casting all your anxieties on him, because he cares for you."

3. My Father in heaven knows all my needs and will supply all my needs.

Matthew 6:31-33: "Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."

4. God *values* me more than birds and grass, which he richly provides for and adorns; how much more will he provide for all my needs!

Matthew 6:26-30: "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith?"

5. The worst someone can do to me is to kill me and take things from me!

Matthew 6:25: "Do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?" [I.e., you still have eternal life even if you have no food; you will still have a resurrection body even if you are physically deprived.]

Luke 12:4: "Do not fear those who kill the body, and after that have nothing more that they can do."

Luke 21:16, 18: "Some of you they will put to death. . . . But not a hair of your head will perish."

Romans 8:31-32, 35, 38-39: "If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? . . . Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? . . . For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

6. Anxiety is pointless.

Matthew 6:27: "Which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?" [Answer: no one.]

7. Anxiety is worldly.

Matthew 6:31-32: "Do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the *Gentiles* seek after all these things. . . . "

<u>James 4:4</u>: "You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God."

8. Tomorrow has enough to worry about and doesn't need my help.

Matthew 6:34: "Do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble."

Lamentations 3:23: "[God's mercies] are new every morning."



NEW CASTLE CITY RESCUE MISSION NEEDS YOUR HELP



It is never too early to plan for the Holidays. Especially when planning involves helping those less fortunate.

When we think of Thanksgiving we think of turkey, stuffing, pumpkin pie, cranberry sauce, vegetables etc., all food items familiar to a traditional Thanksgiving Day dinner and how thankful we are to enjoy such a feast. But there are hundreds of families in Beaver, Butler, Lawrence and Mercer counties who would not be able to enjoy all those traditional Thanksgiving foods if it weren't for the food baskets prepared by the New Castle City Rescue Mission.

Beginning July 1 through November 11, Prince of Peace will once again begin collecting various items to help provide a Thanksgiving meal to these less fortunate families in our county and the surrounding counties. A box will be placed in the hallway to the Fellowship Hall for your donations. Last year we collected 308 canned items. Let's challenge ourselves to collect 1,000 items. We will be collecting food for 20 weeks. If every member donates 1 can per week we can easily reach surpass that goal.

The following items are needed: Large and small cans of pumpkin, canned turkey gravy, evaporated milk, cranberry sauce, canned vegetables and fruit, boxes of stuffing and pie crust.
