Who you going to call?

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness! You have given me relief when I was in distress. Be gracious to me and hear my prayer!" (Ps. 4:1 ESV) – A Psalm of David.

"And rising very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he {Jesus} departed and went out to a desolate place, and there he prayed." (Mar 1:35 ESV)

"I have so much business I cannot get on without spending three hours daily in prayer," attributed to Martin Luther, and while not found in his writings, sums up his prayer life quite succinctly.

Looking at the lives of the prophets and the men of God in Scripture, prayer is not a little habit, but a foundation of their lives. Jesus himself had a life prayer. He prayed at his baptism, before being led into the wilderness to be tempted by Satan. He prayed before choosing the twelve disciples. He prayed before teaching and healing, and He prayed before His suffering and death on the cross.

In the <u>Celebration of Discipline</u>, Richard Foster notes that "All who have walked with God have viewed prayer as the main business of their lives... It was the most serious work of their most productive years."

Prayer, like any other spiritual discipline, can be difficult. Our prayers can seem like the "empty phrases" that Jesus warns us against (Matt. 6:7). The busyness of life can make it difficult to keep to schedule. Exhaustion and other concerns can cause us to forget what to pray for. So what do we do?

First, when our prayers become empty, when the task of praying is joyless – get back to Scripture. Luther suggests saying quietly and word for word the Ten Commandments, the Creed and then reading the words of Christ, or Paul, or one of the psalms. Prayer is conversation with God, and so we must begin by letting God speak to us.

Second, set aside a time to pray. Turn off the phone and the computer, let your family know that this is prayer time, so there are no distractions. Luther suggest that you pray when you first get up in the morning, and just before bed in order to avoid letting other affairs take hold of your attention.

Finally, hands folded and eyes close, speak softly as briefly as you can. Our prayers do not have to be long recitations of our needs and desires, of the problems that we face in our lives or in the lives of our loved ones. In my own devotions, I keep a prayer journal, a list of people and things to pray for. As I turn through the pages, it keeps me focused and brief in my prayers.

Our Lord invites us to "call upon him." He has promised to deliver us. When we prayer, we are doing as God instructed and it pleases Him.
