Stewardship is very much something we're constantly growing into throughout our lifetime. As we study God's Word and hear it preached to us, we "go on to maturity." Heb 6:1 ESV) As you are reading this, you are receiving further instruction in stewardship. *"Be clear minded and self-controlled so that* **you** can pray." Notice, "praying" is not considered "optional". (As you grow in the faith, you will pray. It is what a mature Christian does. *"Love each other deeply, offer hospitality to one another."* Why, because this is what Jesus taught us to do, calls us to do and showed us how to do it by dying for our sins.
