Mixed in with all these celebrations is confirmation, which you've heard me say "isn't a graduation." I fear I may say it too often, yet it is a fact of life that the Church loses members immediately afterwards.

there is – from the church? Confirm it and you'll never see it again."

The general feeling at any graduation celebration is that learning is over. Obviously this isn't true. Yes, we learn things in high school and college, but we continue learning throughout our lives. In regards to our faith, God wants it this way as well.

"And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates... take care lest you forget the LORD." (Deu 6:6-12 ESV)

Notice the progression of this passage. The Word of God shall be on *your* heart. Then, *you* teach those words to your children, repeatedly – not just one time. And do it when you sit and when you walk, in other words, all the day long. And then the focus goes back to *you*, *you* shall have the Word of God before you at all times, lest you forget the Lord.

Martin Luther said, "He who goes on his way thinking that he has faith and has completely mastered its meaning is in a more dangerous condition than he knows nothing about it." Or to put it another way, "a little knowledge is a dangerous thing." Luther confessed that he himself is "not done with" basic theology. If he does not study it daily, he says "I feel a definite loss because of this neglect. God gave the Word that we should impress it on ourselves and practice it. Without this practice our souls become rusty, as it were, and we lose ourselves." June 2017 Volume 43, Issue 6

Please consider joining us. There is information out on the table in the narthex. Be sure to take a look. Don't miss this opportunity!



Estate planning is often avoided, even among Christians. No one wants to think about death. Many times, difficult choices need to be made and the process can be cumbersome. However, this end-of-life planning is as important of a time for the person who dies as it is for those who are left behind.

Spiritually, proper Christian estate planning protects, projects and transfers the blessings of God's abundant kindness. This kindness can be partially measured by wealth, but wealth doesn't begin to capture relationships, or the sense of meaning that other, more powerful factors quantify.
