

Buried with Jesus?

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In Christ Jesus,

It's a little earlier than normal, but Easter is already upon us. And while each Sunday we focus on the good work that Christ has done in His suffering and death on the cross, Holy Week narrows our focus. We look at those last days, those last hours in greater detail than at any other time of the year.

The Apostle John says that Jesus "is the propitiation for our sins." (1Jo 2:2 ESV) Propitation is not a word we use in day-to-day usage. It means to "appease or mollify the wrath of God." We earned the wrath of God by our sins. And Jesus was put forth "to make propitiation" for us by His blood. That's the story of His life. That's the Gospel message, that we were reconciled to God by the blood of His Son shed on the cross.

But that's not the only way to look at the death and resurrection of Jesus. We can also look at it through the lens of our Baptism. Paul says in Romans 6:3, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Rom 6:3 ESV) Christ's death on the cross is our death on the cross. It is our sins that He died. He paid the penalty for our sins by His death. In Baptism, Christ's work is applied to us.

But there's more. Paul goes on to say in verse 4, "We were buried therefore with him by baptism..." (Rom 6:4 ESV) Just as Jesus was covered by the earth in His burial, we are buried in the waters of Holy Baptism. Christ's rest in the tomb on the Sabbath is also our rest in the tomb.

But wait! (as the commercials say) there's still more. Verse 4 concludes, "We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." (Rom 6:4 ESV) Our death and burial through baptism concludes with our resurrection through faith. Just as God raised Jesus from the grave, He will also raise us from the grave as well.

It's for this reason that Christians don't grieve as others do. For most of those outside Christianity, death is it. There is no tomorrow. For those with an afterlife, there is no guarantee that you or your loved ones will actually make it there. But for those in Christ, we have God's sure and certain promise and we have Jesus as proof that our Heavenly Father will keep His promises.

As we enter into Holy Week this year and reflect on Christ's death on the cross, rest in the tomb and resurrection, let us remember that His death, His rest and His resurrection are ours through faith by the promise delivered in our Baptism.

COUPLES DINNER


