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During a recent episode of "The Walking Dead", I had the thought that they get monsters right. – I suppose I should explain that. During my lifetime, monsters, which use to be creatures of evil, things to be feared, to be hunted down and destroyed, are now our fluffy, misunderstood friends. You can see this all over our popular culture. For children, Sesame Street has had fluffy, cuddly monsters like Grover, the Count, and Cookie monster for 46 years. Cartoons once had a teenage Frankenstein, Dracula and Wolfman solving crimes. And of course, two of the biggest Pixar animated films in recent years were Monsters Inc. and Monsters U. It seems that contemporary monsters have all been created by toy companies rather than archetypes of the universal unconscious.

It's not different for adults. In the last decade we've seen Dracula assume the powers of evil in order to protect his family and nation. Frankenstein is no longer a monster, but a defender of humanity against demons throughout the world. Maleficent, the "Mistress of All Evil" from Sleeping Beauty has become protector of the fairy lands and heroine of the story. Even the totally human Dexter, a serial killer, kills only those who have escaped the justice system, using his desire to kill for the good of all.

Monsters, who were once defined as a person or animal that deviates from normal or acceptable behavior, full of wickedness or cruelty, are now simply misunderstood, they're the good guys.

And that's why I like "The Walking Dead". They get monsters right. I'm not speaking of the zombies, the creatures who attack any living thing. They're like a force of nature, like a hurricane or an earthquake, they do what they do. If you deny their nature, they will kill you, just as a hurricane will if you think it's just a windy day. Zombies are not the monsters; they're not "the Walking Dead."

The Monsters in The Walking Dead, are the people who still live. In order to survive in this new world, the main cast wrestles with doing or not doing monstrous things to other living people. They kill, they steal, and they hide so they don't have to share their limited resources with others who have less. And they meet others who don't wrestle with these moral issues that face them, who have either given up all sense of right and wrong or have simply redefined these issues for their own benefit.

The Walking Dead are sinners, just like you and me. Over the doors to our church we ought to hang signs that say, "HERE THERE BE MONSTERS!" because we are. We wrestle with the moral laws that God has given to us, with our anger, with our unwillingness to share the blessings God has given us, with our reluctance to forgive the sins of other monsters. And when we leave church, we ought to post a warning "HERE THERE BE MONSTERS" at the ends of the driveways, because as we go out into the world, who doesn't struggle with God's law because they have either given up or have simple redefined it for their own benefit.

And yet, we should not be afraid of the monster within or without. Jesus Christ died on a cross to forgive our monstrous ways. The Father and the Son sent the Holy Spirit upon to change us from monsters to princes and princesses of light, just as Beauty changed the Beast back into a prince. And as the Royal Priesthood, we carry this marvelous cure on God's behalf out into the world of monsters that they too might become royalty as well.

By the power of God's grace, and the forgiveness of our sins, may we all become monster hunters until none are left and all are children of His Kingdom. In Christ Jesus,
