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Dear Friends in Christ,

On the Day of Pentecost, 50 days after the first Easter, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the followers of Jesus. Jesus had conquered death by rising from the dead. He had ascended up to heaven and now the Holy Spirit came with power to send the first Christians out into the world to make new disciples.

Unlike Christmas we don't prepare by placing trees in our homes or decorating our homes with lights and shopping for gifts. Unlike Easter we don't prepare by dying eggs, holding egg hunts and filling baskets with chocolate bunnies. In fact we don't prepare at all with the exception of pastors. Even though we as a society do not prepare for Pentecost, it is still a busy season. It is the season of proms, graduations and weddings. It is a season of Mothers' Day and Fathers' Day. It is a season of shopping for bathing suits, shorts and sandals. It is a season of day trips and vacations.

On the day of Pentecost the disciples of Jesus were busy too. They had spent 40 days with the risen Jesus then witnessed his ascension. Here is what Jesus had told his followers:

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts1:8 ESV)

Those apostles were gathered together in one place when the Holy Spirit descended upon them in the form of tongues of fire. This was a final moment, a turning point in their lives in which there could be no going back. From the Last Supper to the Day of Pentecost the disciples of Jesus had been on an emotional roller coaster bouncing between good news and despair. The giving of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost was a sign of the fulfillment of the kingdom that is to come in Jesus name.

From that first Pentecost until today the Church has proclaimed Jesus as Lord and Savior to the whole world. Every generation has proclaimed the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the next so that the Church might continue on.

On May 15th, Pentecost Sunday we again remember what happened on the first Pentecost. Four young gentlemen will remember their baptisms and the receiving of the Holy Spirit as they go through their rite of confirmation. We all will again receive the command of Jesus to go into the world and proclaim the Gospel. The color of Pentecost is RED to remind us of the fire of the Holy Spirit. It is customary for not only pastors, but the lay people to dress in red on this day to remember that we too have received the Holy Spirit. We are reminded of the great variety of peoples and languages there are in the world who need the Good News of Jesus. We are reminded that the disciples of Jesus went into the world setting for us an example to follow.

Jesus Christ has risen from the dead!! Alleluia!!

We are the people who continue to proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord of all..

Church and Ministry Bible Study

We have just begun a **new adult Bible study on Sunday mornings** with the above title. It was prepared at the 150th anniversary of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, partly because of significant misconceptions about the <u>relationship</u> between the Office of the Public Ministry and the Priesthood of Believers. The survey taken last summer at Prince of Peace suggests that this should be a helpful topic for us all to learn what the Bible says. Let me share with you part of the Introduction and a couple of Bible verses.

"Among the great treasures contained in the Holy Scriptures are the doctrines of the Holy Ministry and the Priesthood of Believers. These precious truths, under-appreciated by many in modern times, remain a cherished possession of the church. Their full implications for the life and work of the church called to make known the saving grace of God in Jesus Christ, however, need to be continually explored and appreciated if we are to remain faithful to God's Word in our time and place."

"This four-part study of the Office of the Public Ministry and the Priesthood of Believers is designed to be a basic guide into the Word on these teachings. Leaders especially will want to note that the focus of these studies is on the *relationship* between the pastoral office and the Priesthood of Believers. The first two lessons treat the topics in a general, foundational way, while the final two lessons seek to help the participants apply what the Scriptures teach to contemporary questions and issues. The participants in your study group are encouraged to suggest additional Scripture passages pertinent to your study, Continue to encourage one another as you expand your search in the Word. Finally, please note that each lesson has four focus points: (A Thought for Reflection, A Question for Discussion, A Topic to Explore, A Responsibility to Own) to facilitate more in depth discussion. It may be that you will wish to spread this four-part study over eight weeks, devoting two sessions to each part."

If anyone "sets his heart on" becoming a pastor, St. Paul wrote to Timothy, "he desires a noble task." (1 Tim 3:1). In 1 Pet. 2:9 Peter writes, "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God..." Reflecting on these words, Luther wrote: "We are all priests before God if we are Christians."

Please join us for this study in the fellowship hall at 9:00 a.m. Come early for coffee.

In addition to leading this Bible study, I have transitioned into more of a consulting/ mentoring role as we seek to apply what we've learned about <u>living</u> Biblical Peacemaking, and implementing the recommendations made as a result of the survey taken last summer by the Pittsburgh Pastoral Institute. I will be leading those efforts in conjunction with the Elders and Council.

I am still available to schedule private interviews with anyone who would like to talk to me about any conflicts that may require some mediation assistance or about your vision for the future of Prince of Peace. We will also be planning some group "listening events" to get input from the congregation after Pastor Michael and I return from the training workshop in Charlotte, NC by Ted Kober and Ambassadors of Reconciliation May 3-7.

Stay tuned for dates and further details!

Paul wrote to the church at Corinth, "God has <u>committed</u> to <u>us</u> the <u>message</u> of <u>reconciliation</u>. **We are therefore Christ's ambassadors**, as though God were making His appeal through us." (2 Cor 5:18-21)

Isn't that another way of expressing the Great Commission to make disciples of all people? Isn't that who Jesus is calling us to be? Isn't that our <u>mission</u> as a church? We are His ambassadors to whom He has given the message of reconciliation so that God can make His appeal to our lost and broken families and neighbors through us.

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Happy Resurrection / Easter season! See you in church! Bring a friend!—Pastor Fred
