# Birthday Celebrations

Dear Friends in Christ,

What did you do on your last birthday? How did you celebrate it? Was there a big party? Was there cake and decorations? Did you get a lot of presents?

Birthdays are really interesting. When we're really young, others (Mom, Dad, Grandparents) are more interested in celebrating our birthdays then we are. As we get older, we start taking an interest in what comes with our birthdays, the presents and gifts, the parties and celebrations. As we hit our teen years, we start looking forward to those special milestones; the day we can start to drive, to vote, to be legally called an adult.

Of course, things start to reverse. Those special milestones; AARP membership, senior discounts become things we dread. And, if by the grace of God, we get really old, others (Sons, Daughters, Grandchildren, Great-Grandchildren) are more interest in celebrating our birthdays than we are.

This month, we are going to celebrate a special milestone. On October 31, it is the 495<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Martin Luther posting the 95 Thesis on the Wittenberg Church door. On that cold, October day, Luther proposed a debate on the issue of indulgences – the practice of buying and selling the forgiveness of sins. He had no intention of dividing the church. He and the other Reformers wanted to reform the abuses that were taking place within the church.

This anniversary is a bittersweet one. On one hand, we see the breech in the body of Christ – the multiple divisions within the Christian Church for which we must pray that God would overcome the weak faith of His people and restore unity to His Church. On the other hand, we rejoice that God has provided faithful pastors and teachers who purely teach the Gospel and rightly administer the sacraments. We rejoice that the Church is and remains holy in spite of the failings of its members.

As we approach the birthday of the Reformation, let us pray for the Church – that God would continue to raise up pastors and teachers, that He would keep His Word pure and holy, and that body of Christ would healed of its divisions so that we might all worship and pray together.

## NEW CASTLE CITY RESCUE MISSION **NEEDS YOUR HELP**



It is never too early to plan for the Holidays. Especially when planning involves helping those less fortunate.

When we think of Thanksgiving we think of turkey, stuffing, pumpkin pie, cranberry sauce, vegetables etc., all food items familiar to a traditional Thanksgiving Day dinner and how thankful we are to enjoy such a feast. But there are hundreds of families in Beaver, Butler, Lawrence and Mercer counties who would not be able to enjoy all those traditional Thanksgiving foods if it weren't for the food baskets prepared by the New Castle City Rescue Mission.

We will be collecting until November 11, Prince of Peace will once again begin collecting various items to help provide a Thanksqiving meal to these less fortunate families in our county and the surrounding counties. A box will be placed in the hallway to the Fellowship Hall for your donations. Last year we collected 308 canned items. Let's challenge ourselves to collect 1,000 items. We will be collecting food for 20 weeks. If every member donates 1 can per week we can easily surpass that goal.

The following items are needed: Large and small cans of pumpkin, canned turkey gravy, evaporated milk, cranberry sauce, canned vegetables and fruit, boxes of stuffing and pie crust.

# First Trinity Homeless Ministry needs your assistance!

Our family recently visited First Trinity Lutheran Church in Shadyside and we were made aware that cuts in government assistance and increases in public transportation costs are bringing more people to First Trinity Homeless Ministry than ever before. They are beginning to run out of some supplies and would greatly appreciate the following:

- Shampoo they are totally out of it.
- Deodorant—all gone
- Foldable, umbrella style baby stroller that can be taken on a bus; other types are prohibited and Moms must carry parcels and bags
- Adult diaper/Depends/Poise pads for people over 125 pounds; sometimes people are giving these away when no longer needed. Try to get these for FTHM
- Disposable baby diapers size 4 and 5
- · Sensible, serviceable shoes for men and women
- Men's trousers and shorts, not jeans; specific request for waist size 42
- Clothing and underwear for a man that wears 3x; always need larger sizes 16 & up
- · Bar soap, especially Dove, and body wash
- Toilet paper, people also for facial tissue
- Disposable razors, shaving cream, toothpaste
- Clothing and coats for men, women, children and babies of any size and type blankets, bedcovers, sheets
- · Small toys for children
- Fruit cups, drink boxes or Capri Sun drinks, individually wrapped snacks

Donations can be dropped in the collection box located in the narthex or pick ups can be arranged. Monetary donations are also welcome. Checks can be made out to First Trinity Lutheran Church Homeless Ministry.
