

For the Youth

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Dear Friends in Christ,

I was thirteen. It was Ash Wednesday. My family had come to church early in order to dine with our fellow believers in Christ. But it doesn't take long to eat soup and a sandwich. So I made my way upstairs, to our balcony, where the new sound equipment had just been installed. My inner "geek" was thrilled. Far beyond the old vacuum tube system we used to have, this new beautiful, black board with sliders and digital readouts would serve our church well. Not yet confirmed, I knew I would have to wait before I had my chance to serve.

As I sat admiring, but not touching, a hand rested on my shoulder. Mr. Lempke, the chief radio engineer was standing there. He looked down at me and said, "Why don't you run it tonight." I was in heaven. Nobody had told Mr. Lempke that "there's nothing for the youth in church." From that point on I served on our Radio Board, providing sound and rebroadcasts of our services throughout my teenage years. Soon I had a key to the radio room, entrusted with thousands of dollars of equipment.

Not long after, my birthday came. I was fourteen and newly confirmed. My family arrived early for church; our early service was broadcast live on the radio and Dad was narrating that month. As I was about to enter the Sanctuary, I felt a hand on my shoulder, it was Mr. Houston. "We're one short," he said, handing me a stack of bulletins and pointing me toward a door. I greeted people, handed out bulletins, escorted people to empty seats (yes, this was in the days when Ushers – "ushed" because pews were full.)

At the end of the service, as we were cleaning up the left-behind bulletins, making the Sanctuary ready for the next service, Mr. Houston turned to me and said, "be here at 7:30 next week, you're on my crew." Nobody had told him that "there's nothing for the youth in church." For the next six years, I arrived early, opened doors, turned on lights, made sure the air conditioning was going.

Throughout my young life, God placed people who never told me "there's nothing for the youth in church". They pointed me to the gifts of God that we receive in worship, and then invited me to serve along with them. Before I had keys to the car, I had keys to the church, the radio equipment, and even the communion wine. Before I could drive, my parents made sure to take me to church so I could do the things asked of me.

Over the years there's this cycle that's been going on in the churches: the youth leave, a cry rings out, "there's nothing for the youth in church. Something must be done." And we do things; new programs, new liturgies, new lights and screens. And the youth leave, and a cry goes out: Repeat, over and over again. According to latest data, two-thirds of this current generation will leave and never come back. Voices are raised, the cry goes forth, "there's nothing for the youth in church."

But I wonder...I mean, you really have to consider—are the youth leaving because we keep telling them over and over again that there's nothing for them in the church? Or perhaps, just perhaps it's **because** we keep telling them over and over again that there's nothing for them in church that the youth are leaving.

Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people, but Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." (Mat 19:13-14 ESV)

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UPDATE ON NEW CASTLE CITY RESCUE MISSION

Due to economic conditions, the New Castle City Rescue Mission will no longer conduct the Thanksgiving Food Basket distribution in Beaver County. Therefore, Prince of Peace will partner with the Unionville United Methodist Church (UUMC), located in New Sewickley Township to support their Food Pantry and Clothes Closet Mission.

UUMC obtains a list of people in the Beaver County community that needs help on a short term basis and finds ways to help them. Sometimes it is with household goods, clothes, and food or house repairs. Easter and Christmas parties are held for the children and the parents are given Easter baskets and Christmas presents for the children. Each year an average of forty five children receive new underwear and socks at Easter, Christmas and the new school year.

The canned food items we have been collecting for the City Rescue Mission will be directed to the UUMC's Food Pantry. In addition, we will continue indefinitely to collect any non-perishable food items for this Pantry.

We hope you will continue to support this need in our community by bringing in your food items and placing them in the container located outside the fellowship hall. A monthly delivery to UUMC will be made.

This session was a workshop designed to help equip you to handle those difficult witnessing moments. We all have those fears – what do I say, how do I answer their questions? What we learned is that it's not about what you say, but what you hear. Probably the most important part of sharing our faith is listening, not speaking. It was repeated over and over that we need to "listen like we mean it" and so we "earn the right to speak". What we want to share with others is our relationship with God and the only way to effectively do that is to develop a relationship with the person first. People are influenced so much more by what we do than by what we say so when we take the time to listen and show the person we really do care, the Holy Spirit will give us the words to speak when the person is most receptive to hear them.

During the month of September our Science topic was the caterpillar and the butterfly. The children were very enthusiastic about it! They asked so many questions. <u>3 YEAR OLD CLASS</u> The three year old class started their alphabet book and **love** story time. We read Jack and the Beanstalk and planted our very own "beanstalk"! Make sure it gets plenty of sunshine and water. Everyone is working to recognize their own name. We play fun games like the "Name Game" and "Musical Names." The three year olds are getting use to all the rules of the room so they can settle into a routine and become pros just like the four year olds!

"What makes us special?"—GOD MADE US!

We started counting in Spanish and are learning some words in Spanish as well! The children are picking it up fast! They love learning a new word each week. We have started our alphabet books and everyone is doing a great job!

We have been very blessed with all the new and returning faces of our students as we embark on our 169 day journey through the 2013-2014 school year.

The month of September has been a month all about Creation in both the three year old and four year old classes. We taught the students how many days it took God to create the heavens and the Earth, and that he rested on day seven. God created us and that is what makes us special! We also celebrated during Chapel with a song from Genesis. That song and dance was nothing short of entertaining. The students enjoyed their parents, friends, and neighbors watching.

During this entire school year, Mrs. Shuttleworth's classes and ours will be learning the alphabet out of order, starting with the letter W. The letter W represented a WELCOME week for all our classes. The other letters we focused on this month were B, F, & C. During B, week we focused on the Monarch butterflies that would soon be hatching in their habitats we have provided them in each class room. The students are keeping close track of each cocoon in the anticipation of a butterfly soon emerging. When we got to letter F, it was the first day of Fall on the calendar. During F, week we focused on the coming of the season Fall and created an art project using paper towels cut into leaf shapes with paint that would run together creating vibrant fall colors. The last week of September was letter C. The letter C coincided with the caterpillars that will turn into beautiful butterflies (fingers crossed).

At the very end of September, our students brought their best smiles for picture day! We are off to a wonderful start in both classes. We are looking for positive attitudes toward learning from all the boys and girls. The children are full of energy and so much fun; we are learning to channel the energy for the good of the classes.
