It's Not Special

Oxygen, is not special. By weight it is the third most common element in *the universe*. Oxygen comprises about twenty-one percent of our atmosphere. In various alloys it makes up 49% of the earth's crust and 45% of the earth's mantle. Oxygen makes up 7/8ths of every drop of water, every river, stream, and ocean. Oxygen is not special.

But, boy-oh-boy is it necessary.

Without oxygen, there is no life. Without oxygen, our cells cannot turn the nutrients we consume into energy for our bodies. Without oxygen, we wouldn't have skin, or teeth, or nails. Oxygen isn't special, at least looking at it from a chemical perspective, but ask someone with asthma, chronic bronchitis, pneumonia, tuberculosis, or emphysema and they will tell you not only how necessary oxygen is, but how absolutely special it is.

Every week we gather together to hear the Lord's Word, to participate in the Liturgy, and to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Every week, I put on my alb, my cross, and my stole – only changing the colors based on the season. Every week, we sing hymns, we stand and sit and stand again. The creeds we confess, the liturgy we use, even some of the hymns we sing can be traced all the way back to the first and second century of the Church. Every week, it's the same old, same old, it's just not special.

But, boy-oh-boy is it necessary.

Without the Word, without the Sacrament we don't have God. Without God, we are dead in our sins, condemned to everlasting torment in the fires of hell. When we gather together around Word and Sacrament, God is gifting us forgiveness, life, and salvation. He has promised us that the Holy Spirit works through the means of grace to sanctify us and keep us in the one, true faith – which believes Jesus died on a cross for our sins. St John wrote, "Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God. Whoever abides in the teaching has both the Father and the Son." (2Jo 1:9 ESV)

State of the church

At the June Voters' Meeting, the voters asked Council to compose a "State of the Church" letter in order to clarify how things are developing within the church and where we are headed. Respectfully, I submit this letter to the members of Prince of Peace. – Pastor Michael

Blessings

A quick review of the Apostle Paul's letters show that they overwhelmingly start with praise and thanksgiving to our Lord and God for the overwhelming blessings that He has poured out upon His people. It seems good to me, that this letter should follow that precedence.

- First and foremost we remember the great blessings of God given to us in our baptisms and through the Holy Word. In Jesus Christ, He has chosen you, He has forgiven you all your sins and made you His children, heirs of His heavenly kingdom. He has brought us together as His church, to serve Him both now, and into eternity.
- We are blessed with a clear confession and teaching of the church as found in the Book of Concord and with the traditions handed down to us by the church fathers. Because of this, we are rooted in Holy Scripture, in the clear teachings of the prophets, apostles, and our Lord Jesus Christ.
- We are blessed with a beautiful location in which we gather to worship. We are blessed with the land, with the pavilion, fellowship hall and a wonderful sanctuary which are used to the glory of Almighty God.
- We are blessed with many volunteers. They have been present at dinners, VBS, Sunday school, pre-school and many other events. The

volunteers serve the church by maintaining the grounds, by supporting the staff of our pre-school, and by taking care of the upkeep of the buildings.

- We are blessed with a strong synod that provides many educational materials for our growth in the maturity of faith.
- In October, we will join with Lutherans from around the Pittsburgh region to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation.
- In September, leaders of the congregation participated in Re: Vitality, a program which gives us tools to help us move the connections we have with people into Word and Sacrament ministries.

And I could go on. Our preschool continues to teach the love of Jesus to many kids each year. Our VBS program has grown in attendance. We support missionaries and seminary students and two separate food and clothing banks. And our staff is the finest group of people that I could ever hope to work with.

Challenges

Of course, with abundant blessings come abundant challenges. God doesn't call us to sit around and do nothing, we are to serve Him. Let's look at some of our challenges.

- ❖ Church attendance. I cannot stress enough how important regular attendance at church is. As we gather together, God acts to keep faith alive and well through His Word and in the Sacrament He provides. Far too many families and members do not understand this. Granted, there are those who are physically unable to attend and there are times when our vocations, due to travel or scheduling, interfere with attendance. But too often irregular church attendance results from

less important affairs taking precedence over regular and faithful worship of God. We should not be surprised, then, when our habit of skipping church occasionally turns into the next generation's habit of skipping church regularly leading to a generation that has nothing to do with the Church and the gifts God provides there through Word and Sacrament. The tragic result is not lower attendance at church, but the loss of faith for our children and grandchildren.

- ❖ Stewardship. We often talk about stewardship in relation to our time, our talents, and our treasure. I'd like to address each one individually.
 - Our time: We have good, faithful stewards of their time who serve this congregation on a regular basis, but we need many more of you to be directly involved in service. There are many opportunities for the members of Prince of Peace to serve each other and our neighbors, but we cannot do this great work placed before us without the members of this congregation being present. We need people to serve as ushers, sound technicians, greeters, counters, visitors to our sick and shut-ins, and many, many other areas. Many hands make light work, and when we all contribute together, more gets done.
 - Our talents: In our baptism, God has gifted to us the Holy Spirit, who produces in us the fruit of the Spirit; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These are gifts given to all the Saints, although because of our sinful nature we do not always bear such good fruit. But beyond the gifts of the Spirit, God has created each one of us, individually, with gifts to be used for

the good of our neighbor. For some it's the gift of the green thumb, or the understanding of finances, cooking, or music. Perhaps you have the talent for carpentry, plumbing or other manual work. We are not to use these gifts for our own benefit, but to serve God through the service of our neighbors. We need these gifts used for the sake of the church, to enable us to go out to our neighbors and share the good news of Jesus Christ.

- Our treasure: As you know, many families in this area have been affected by the downturn in our economy over the last few years. Many people are unemployed or underemployed. And when our families are affected, so is Prince of Peace. As most of you know, Prince of Peace has been operating right at our budget line. As of the August council meeting, our offerings are ahead of budget by just \$59. In order to be "in the black" we've had to cut back on our church tithes to various groups outside of Prince of Peace.

In all matters of stewardship, it is important for us to remember that God's Stewards are God's Stewards. All that we have in our time, talents, and treasure are first and foremost God's, who has blessed us with them. We must always strive to use what we have to the glory of God.

- ❖ Age: We are an aging congregation. Half of the members of this congregation are older than 49. As we age, we are physically unable to do the things we did when we were younger. Adding to this challenge is the change in our culture. Fifty years ago, only the father worked outside the home. Today, in most families both parents work leaving them less time to work at the church.

We are desperately in need of help on Altar Guild. Setting the altar for communion is not anything to fear. It is easy to learn the set up and Pastor Mike seldom has a complaint (if ever). It takes a matter of minutes to set up before a service and to clean up after. Not to mention the joy of the personal time spent with the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Time not unlike that spent in prayer and meditation on the blessing of the Lord's Supper.

Please consider volunteering to help us. It is a most rewarding effort. It does not require a college degree, nor does it require references. It involves minimal training and possibly one fifteen-minute meeting per year. No dues and no dress code. The pay is far more than monetary and the hours are of your own choosing. Not to mention the fact that your coworkers are really nice people!
