Troubling Times

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this, we are experiencing troubling times. There is a growing Islamic state in Iraq and Syria that is beheading and crucifying those who do not surrender to their authority and beliefs. For two weeks, riots and looting have occurred in Ferguson, Missouri following the shooting of Michael Brown. Food prices have been soaring, for some staples like bread, pasta and eggs over the last decade the minimum increase has been 40% and gasoline has risen at a whopping 158%. And let's not forget the recent outbreak of the Ebola virus, a disease that kills between 50% and 90% of all infected.

Life seems to be getting tougher and tougher. What ought a Christian to do? Well, here are some thoughts.

We pray: God desires us, commands us, to call upon Him in the day of trouble (Ps. 50.15). He promises to deliver us, to save us. We pray for those who are suffering, who are being persecuted that God might rescue them and comfort them. We pray for peace, that healing of bodies and souls might occur.

We pray also for our enemies. Even more than a Christian who is suffering, those who do not yet know God need our prayers. Standing apart from the Lord, unrepentant of their sins, they face His awful wrath. We pray, that God might work in their hearts, transforming their lives as He has already done with ours. We pray that God's kingdom come, so that all men might be ruled by not by their own desires, but by the will of God.

We act: The words of Christ, His actions, clearly teach to serve those in need. We serve Him by serving those around us. Here at Prince of Peace, our most predominant way that we do that is through the First Trinity giving and the United Methodist food bank in Unionville. This summer our VBS aided a sister Lutheran congregation through Lutheran Disaster Relief. But we can do this in individual ways as well, donate blood, purchase supplies, and volunteer our time. Jesus said that "all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35 ESV)

Finally, **we hope**. What we're experiencing was predicted. Jesus said there would be wars and rumors of wars, brothers would turn against brothers. In the book of Revelation, it is revealed that there would be disease and starvation, and a massive increase in the price of food. These things that we are facing are simply the signs that we live in the last days. There is nothing that our God does not know or control. And He has promised that soon, our Lord will return and make all things new.

What do we do in troubling times? We confess as King David did:

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord (Ps. 23:1-6 ESV)

Food Drive

Please continue to support our partnership with the Unionville United Methodist Church Food Pantry by bringing in your non-perishable food items such as cereal, soup, mac & cheese, peanut butter, jelly, cookies, etc. Your support is greatly appreciated.

Parking Lot Fund

In January 2011 the Church Council, with the assistance of our Thrivent Financial representative, Chuck Taylor, allocated a portion of the generous gift bequeathed by Hilda Roeck in her last will and testament to an investment with Thrivent. Interest rates were very low and it was felt that by investing in the Thrivent Moderate Conservative Allocation Fund we could improve the rate of return. So \$20,000 was invested!

As of June 30, 2014 the value of that investment had grown to \$24,000. Council realized that we are blessed to have this "good news;" and, further recognized the need to start putting monies aside for the repair of the parking lot (especially the driveways). Therefore, shares in the amount of \$3,855 were redeemed on July 1 and the proceeds are the "seed monies" for the Parking Lot Fund.

It is almost certain that the costs to properly repair just the driveways will be significantly greater than the \$3,855. At the present time, Bill Hewlett (Chair of the Properties Board) has invited contractors to submit proposals. Also, Council has NOT made any decision on further fund raising to pay for the work that is required. In the meantime, prayerfully consider using the Special Designation Gift envelope in your packet to support the Parking Lot Fund.
