## Trouble in Paradise

Dear Friends in Christ,
You might say it was his church. Paul has spent three years in Ephesus, longer than any other congregation he served. But in his absence, problems arose. There was a rivalry between believers, between the Jewish and Gentile Christians. There arose problems of spiritual unfaithfulness, marital unfaithfulness and even spiritual warfare.

In the letter to the Ephesians, Paul reminds the believers that they are members of the church by God's grace, predestined to heirs of the kingdom of God from before the foundation of the world. They have become a new creation in Christ Jesus. He then encourages them:
"I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit-- just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call-- one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift." (Ephesians 4:1-7 ESV)

What is true for the Ephesians is also true for us. We have our divisions, not exactly the same as the Ephesians but items that separate us. Our recent survey revealed that all of us are sensitive to the conflict within our church. And what a lot people might say is even more discouraging, many people feel they are only going through the motions during worship.

Yes, we have challenges before us. But we also have, "One body and one Spirit...one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all." The survey indicated that we are not theologically diverse, but united in belief. It showed that a majority of us believe significant change is necessary for the congregation to move forward. And that's good news. Because when we see change is necessary, we are willing to be part of it.

By the time you receive this issue of the Bells, it is my hope that you have from the Pittsburgh Pastoral Institute a better picture of what we, you and I, need to do to transform. There are some specific things just for me as pastor, but there are also things we need to do as a congregation. It cannot be just me, or just the council, all of us must "walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

Our heavenly Father has given us the grace to be His children. Our Lord Jesus Christ has shown us the manner in which we live as brothers and sisters in Him. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to walk in this New Creation. Let us go forth in the name of Christ to do the good works that has been prepared for us.

## John Rosemond's Bill of Rights for Children

Because it is the most character-6uilding, two-letter word in the English language, children have the right to hear their parents say "NO" at least three times a day.

Children have the right to find out early in their fives that their parents don't exist to make them happy, but to offer them the opportunity to learn the skills they - children - will need to eventually make themselves happy.

Children have a right to scream all they want over the decisions their parents make, albeit their parents have the right to confine said screaming to certain areas of their homes.

Children have the right to find out early that their parents care deeply for them, but don't give a hoot what their children think about them at any given moment in time.

Because it is the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, children have the right to hear their parents say "Because I said so" on a regular and frequent basis.

Because it is the most character-building activity a child can engage in, children have the right to share significantly in the doing of household chores.

Every child has the right to discover early in life that he isn't the center of the universe (or his family or his parents' (ives), that he isn't a big fish in a small pond, that he isn't the Second Coming, and that he's not ever in the total scheme of things - very important at all, no one is, so as to prevent him from becoming an insufferable brat.

Children have the right to learn to be gratefulfor what they receive; therefore, they have the right to receive all of what they truly need and very little of what they simply want.

Children have the right to learn early in their lives that obedience to legitimate authority is not optional, that there are consequences for disobedience, and that said consequences are memorable and, therefore, persuasive.

Every child has the right to parents who love him/her enough to make sure he/she enjoys all of the above rights.
