There's the weeping caused by death. There's the weeping caused by grief. Jesus wept over Jerusalem, and over the death of Lazarus. God Himself grieves. He grieves over the sins of the people, over the hardness of their hearts. And that's the source of all our weeping, our lamentations, our moaning and wailing – sin.

In the Bible though, weeping and grief is only eternal for those cast into the outer darkness. It is for those "see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God" but are themselves cast out. (Luk 13:28 ESV) They will weep because they will know fully the grace and love of God, and yet be eternally separated from Him because of their own unrighteousness.

For Christians, "Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning." (Psa 30:5 ESV) Whether it is grief caused by our own sins, by the sins of others; whether it is the mourning caused by death, or simply by loved ones moving away – we know these feelings are temporary. They will not last. There will be an end to them.

For those who believe, who are the Children of God, we have a promise. We have a promise of a new dwelling place for us and for God: "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." (Rev 21:3-4 ESV)

The glow of resurrection offers a light to our path of fruitful service. It guides our journey and illuminates good works to honor and glorify 'Our Father'. In this Glow, His will is done on earth, even as it is in Heaven.
