Death no longer has dominion over us because it has absolutely no dominion over Jesus. We no longer have to fear death because

death doesn't have a final say. Christ made death obsolete, a thing of the past. Yet we still fear death. We try and sanitize death, the pretty silk lined caskets. The embalming and make-up to make the person look like their alive and resting. We mourn as if we will never see our loved one. family member, or friend ever again, but that is a lie. The angel said, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." Jesus is not in a tomb or a grave. Jesus is alive and well, sitting at the right hand of God the Father. He is still flesh and blood. Jesus' heart still beats, blood still flows through His veins. And Jesus is not dead nor is He a ghost or a spirit. Christ Jesus is fully God and fully human, and He is fully alive. He has won the victory for us. St. Paul wrote, "Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." "O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Cor 15:51-56)

Jesus' resurrection has changed everything! Death has been reduced to a mere sleep. A slumber in which we will awaken when Christ returns. 


