Pray to the Lord of the Harvest

Matthew 9:37-38

During the fall of 2020 & 2021 some farmers let didn't harvest their crops. Because of the worldwide shutdown, there was no one to sell their crops to, so they either rotted in the fields or in full silos. It was devastating for the farmers as well as for the consumers because now we are facing food shortages all over the world.

There is another shortage that the world is facing and that is a shortage of faithful pastors. Fewer and fewer men are answering God's call to preach, teach, and administer the Sacraments. Jesus told His disciples to, "pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Mt 9:38) The word "earnest" means, "in a determined manner." Often time people only pray earnestly of a pastor when their own church is vacant. But Jesus' words to His disciples is not relegated to their own faith community, but for the Holy Christian Church everywhere.

Now we may not think that the harvest is plentiful seeing how many churches are dying due to congregational members that have not returned to worship God after the restrictions were lifted and the pandemic was over. But there are churches in which people are experiencing a holy food shortage because they don't have a faithful pastor administering Word and Sacraments to those who are in need of God's gifts of grace and faith. I feel the time is coming when people will return to the house of the Lord because they seek the Light that shines in the darkness of this world. Unfortunately

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those houses of worship will be few and far between as well as the faithful shepherds that lead them. So, let us, all of us, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send faithful pastors into the mission field that is all around us. People are eternally starving to death due to the lack of Word and Sacrament ministry that is not taking place and they don't even know it.

So let us pray earnestly, O Gracious Father, You led Your holy apostles to ordain ministers for the proclamation of Your Word and the faithful administration of the Sacraments of Christ. Grant to all congregation the guidance of the Holy Spirit to choose a suitable, faithful pastors according to Your will for the blessing of Your Church in this place; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.


