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### Don't Give It Up - Just Give

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

The Lenten season is upon us. It's a time to reflect on our sinful condition and our relationship with God who says, "You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy." (Lv 19:2) But often times people seek to "give up" something for Lent. The purpose of abstaining from certain pleasures is to grow closer to God. Because what we are to give up are the things that get in the way of our relationship with God. But the abstinence of things during Lent has become a righteous work, a way of trying to win God's favor or blessing.

The apostle Paul is very clear in his letter to the Ephesians that it is by grace, through faith and not by our own works that we are saved. Just giving up something for Lent negates what Christ accomplished for us, on our behalf, on the cross. Jesus willingly gave up His life to redeem all those who believe in Him. Trying to be holy by giving up something for Lent will not make you holy but will have the opposite effect, it makes you even more of a sinner.

We don't do good works for salvation purposes. We do good works because we are saved. Good works come from the Holy Spirit working in us compelling

us to do the Lord's Will. Paul continued in his letter to the Ephesians with, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Eph 2:10) God had already prepared good works for us to do. So when we do good works we are only doing what God had already planned for us to do.

So, if you want to do something special for Lent then don't give up something, but give something. Give of yourself, help others out, and look for opportunities to bless others with what God

has blessed you with. Not for your salvation, because you are already saved, but to reveal your heavenly Father to others. Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Mt 5:14-16)

It doesn't make God happy when you give up something for Lent. What brings joy to God's heart is when our hearts are broken because of our sins, and we repent of them and confess them to Him. Just as David wrote. "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise." (Ps 51:17) And it pleases God greatly to forgive you of your sins, for Christ's sake, leaving you clean and holy. So, don't give up something for Lent, but joyfully give

from your heart that rejoices in the salvation that Christ has won for you.

Thank you so much for your participation in Operation Christmas Child. We are pleased to report the following shoebox numbers for the 2022 OCC collection to share with your church or group;

Butler/Armstrong Area - **11,257**Mid-Atlantic North Region (PA & NJ) - 610,298
United States total - 9,303,130
Worldwide total - 10,559,907

Even in these relatively hard economic times, all of these numbers represent increases from last year's totals. Praise God for His faithfulness to His program! Our goal for our Butler/Armstrong Area this past year was 11,001 and you helped smash it!

We praise God that since OCC started in 1993 over **206** million children worldwide have received shoebox gifts and have had The Greatest Gift, Jesus, presented to them. Franklin Graham personally delivered the 200 millionth shoebox to a young girl in Ukraine. Since 2009, **30.9** million have gone on to enroll in The Greatest Journey with **over 14.9** million making decisions for Christ. This program consists of 12 colorful and dynamic Bible lessons in the child's own language. Local church members are trained in how to teach it so that the children are able to understand who Jesus is, how to receive Him into their hearts, how to become faithful followers and how to share their faith. The Greatest Journey 12 week discipleship program is also available for use in the U.S.! We want to raise up a generation of believers whose hearts are on fire for Christ and have a desire to share the Good News with their friends and families.

There is a game app based on the Greatest Journey that you can download free just by typing in the search line "greatest journey game app". We've heard good comments from friends who have used it. Be sure to share this info with your church family, groups, and friends. We're sure your children will love it!
