The grave couldn't hold Jesus and because Jesus is in you and you are in Jesus, the grave can't hold you either. D.L. Moody once told his congregation that one day they will read in the paper that he had died. But he told them not to believe it. He will never have been more alive. The day is coming when you too will have real life, true life, eternal life. So take comfort in those sixteen awesome words, because the have changed everything.
