tremendous blessings. This isn't the only place in Scripture in which God tells us this (cf Rm 10:14; Lk 22:19-20; Ac 2:38; Rm 15:30; Ps 30:4). We're taught in Catechism that the Third Commandment means, "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it." (LSC, pg 67) And those who despise going to Church fall from the faith easily because they're following after the world and not God.

The writer of Hebrews speaks about the blessings we receive when we gather together to worship God in community. Because of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, God gives us faith, hope, and love (cf 1 Co 13:13). We also receive encouragement and the strength to do good works for the glory of God. As our congregation goes through, "Gifted for More," we will learn to use the gifts that God has bestowed on each of us to do those good work that God planned for us to do before He created the universe. In the Body of Christ, the Church, we're filled with God's Spirit to do as Paul wrote, "for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure." (Phlp 2:13) God works through us to bless others. And God works through others to bless us.

Summertime is a great time to get out and enjoy God's creation. But when we would rather spend time enjoying creation and not attending worship service, we're worshipping the creation and not the Creator. God requires a very small portion of our time to worshipping Him. And if we can't worship God now for an hour, then why would God force us to worship Him for an eternity. The writer of Hebrews ended verse 25 with, "all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Heb 10:25) Christ's return is closer today than it was yesterday. And when Christ returns, He will judge the world. It's here in the holy ark of the Christian Church that we receive strength for every day of our lives and the reassurance of pardon and peace in Christ's body and blood that allows us to stand without fear on Judgement Day.

Church isn't a drudgery, but a joyous opportunity to be in the presence of an all mighty, awesome, powerful God and Creator.

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God never takes a break from blessing you, so why would we want to take a break from worshipping God by giving Him thanks and praise? God is good all the time! So let us praise Him all the time and come together once a week to hear His Word preached, receive the Sacraments, pray, sing, and give thanks for all of God's tremendous blessings. Amen.
