

The 2023-24 school year has begun, but things look a little different in the classrooms this year. When Mrs. Shuttleworth retired, we posted and advertised to hire a second teacher. Unfortunately, a potential employee had to back out of taking the job before she even started. Keeping the preschool open and servicing the community was very important to us all! We decided to host one classroom with full seats. We utilize both rooms for circle time and different stations when needed. We play in the other room but have our structured class time in the other. So far so good! Mrs. Smith, Ms. Kayla, and Ms. Twila have found our stride. We would like to thank all the families who chose Prince of Peace for their child's early childhood education. We decided to keep the covid schedule which is Monday/Tuesday, 3-year-olds; and Wednesday/Thursday/Friday, 4-year-olds.

During this school year, all classes will be learning the alphabet out of order, starting with the letter W. The letter W represented a WELCOME week for all classes. The other letters we focused on this month were B, F, and C. When we started the letter F, it was the first day of Fall and we created an art project using real leaves to paint and copy their skeleton onto a canvas bag for the students to keep. It was really cool to see the leaves take shape on the bags! Letter C rounded out the month and was all about caterpillars. All classes got to learn about the life cycle of a Monarch butterfly. We used large sized magnets to put the stages in order on the board. The students told me which stage was first, next, and last! Hatching a Monarch butterfly is truly magical!

Finishing up the month of September both classes went on a fieldtrip to Yeck's Farm and took a hayride along with picking their very own pumpkin. The weather cooperated and the students loved running around the farm. Parents were invited to attend.

We are off to a wonderful start in both classes. We are asking for the parents at home to help facilitate more independence in the boys and girls so that they can help with their own class folders, snacks, and crayon boxes. Fine motor skills are also not ready to go and students need practice coloring and holding a pencil.

We are doing extra writing skills practice each week so that the boys and girls can write their letters; students need extra help with skills so that we can get them ready for kindergarten by May. We are looking for positive attitudes toward learning from all the boys and girls and their families. The children are full of energy and so much fun!
