Luke 2:8-14

One of the most poetic sections of St. Luke's Gospel are the seven verses (8-14) in chapter 2. I remember as a child having to memorize these seven verses for our church's Christmas program. And while reciting it during the play, I can remember seeing my mother mouthing the words right along with me as though it were a duet that we were singing. Unfortunately, I can't sing well, I can sing, but it's not good, but my mother had a beautiful voice and as they say, "She sang like an angel." But as wonderful as I thought my mother's singing was, I doubt very highly that she could have matched an angel in that heavenly choir on the day of Christ's birth.

Scripture calls the angelic choir "A multitude of the heavenly host." The word "host" means an "army." John Albert Bengel wrote in his book, "The Gnomon of the New Testament," "Paradoxically an Army that announces peace." After delivering the message to the shepherds, the angels first sing "Glory to God," which is a preliminary necessity for real peace on earth. And the angels continue their song by singing that God will bring peace 'for men on whom His favor rests.' The emphasis here is on God, not man. It's those for whom God had chosen from before the foundations of the earth were set, rather than those who believe they choose God now in their lifetime. And so at the Christ child's birth the angels celebrate with a

song that honors God for what He has has done & will do through His promised Christ.

And the peace of course means peace between God & people, which is the healing of the estrangement caused by Adam & Eve's fall into sin, which has infected all mankind. But in order for this reconciliation to take place the Christ had to be sacrificed to pay for the sins of the world, which will please God & sanctify mankind for whom God's favor rests upon. But the glory of God & the cause for the angelic song stems from the "Good news of great joy." The swaddling cloths will be turned into burial cloths that will be left in an empty tomb. And the Christ child was placed in a feeding trough that will later be an altar. An altar in which Christ's body & blood in bread & wine will feed the multitudes on earth as it is in heaven.


