to God, eat and sing songs of thanksgiving to the Lord for the abundant harvest and for delivering them from Egypt. God instituted the feasts & festivals to point the Israelites to Christ. But not long after the Israelites occupied the Promised Land, they stopped celebrating the feasts & festivals. The sacrifices were a divinely ordained part of Israel's worship and soon they were just going through the motions when they brought an offering to God. There were no songs of praise and thanksgiving, and the people were not the least bit sincere if they did give thanks to God. And so, God rejected their offerings and sacrifices.

This is a tell as old as time. Cain and Abel were commanded by God to make offerings to Him. Abel was sincere in his offerings to God. He gave God the very best of what he had. Abel's offering was true worship and thanksgiving to God. Cain on the other hand, just went through the motions. His heart wasn't in it nor was he thankful for what God had given him. And so, God rejected Cain's offering, which angered Cain.

But instead of repenting and asking for forgiveness, he filled his heart with anger towards his brother for doing what God had commanded him to do. Cain took his brother's life for obeying God. Adam and Eve did know or understand death. They had never experienced it. But now, because of their sin of disobedience they came to know the tremendous grief of sin and death. When God spoke to Cain and, "the LORD said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground. And now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand." (Gen 4:10-11)

Abel was a Christlike figure who sincerely gave his offering from his heart. And for his obedience to their sins and trespasses!"

Christ's blood has washed away all of our sins and trespasses. Like Adam and Eve, we truly do not understand the pain and agony of eternal death. Because of Christ's obedience and willingness to be crucified for the sins of the world, in Him all we will ever know is eternal life. Christ lived the life we're supposed to live, without sin. 
Kidz Club was on 10/18

The fire department even provided a safety packet with a coloring book and crayons. We are taking a collection of cash as donation to the fire department since they are an all-volunteer organization, any little bit helps. We appreciate them taking a day off work to organize and teach our students!

Both preschool classes took a fieldtrip to Yeck's Pumpkin Patch at Yeck's Farm to take a hay ride and play in the sun. The weather actually cooperated this year! The parents escorted their students for our trip and played in the many amenities Yeck's has to offer. Rounding out the morning, we had a snack and each student received a pumpkin and activity bag full of goodies. Thank you Yeck's Farm!

We added three new letters to our writing skills this month; A, O, and H. During letter A week, we focused on apples and the many kinds that grow. We also tasted three kinds of apples and how they taste. The general consensus is that students choose Red Delicious apples over Granny Smith or Golden Delicious.

Letter O week was a discussion about October as we were creating Halloween arts and crafts. Our four year old class did a fun science experiment with pumpkins. We tested whether a pumpkin will sink or float in water. We made a hypothesis and then followed through to find our actual answer. No matter how big or small a pumpkin is, it will always float in water; unless it is cut or hollowed out.

Finishing out the month we focused on the letter H. The letter H represented Halloween and the fun school day. A special "Thank you" goes out to the wonderful parents for providing goodies and facilitating the Halloween party for the students.

Pamela Beglin Licht Memorial Horse Show Update

The horse show may be a distant memory but I wanted to share with you this story to remind us all why we do what we do. Those of you who knew Pam were aware that she had a big heart and was very devoted to her church and family. For that reason, we decided to support Ronald McDonald House with the horse show proceeds this year. Pam's great-nephew, Brody, and his family were greatly blessed by the generosity of those who support the cause and wanted to give something back. Here's their story:



Our son Brody was life-flighted to Children's Hospital of Richmond at five weeks of age due to respiratory distress. Initial tests indicated the common cold, but interestingly, nothing else. After several weeks of hospitalization his health continued to worsen and, after multiple failed attempts to help him breathe, his physicians began to dig further. A CT scan revealed a Double Aortic Arch (very rare type of congenital heart defect) which caused compression upon his esophagus and trachea. During this time, we were offered a stay at a nearby Ronald McDonald House. Brody would go on to have a very lengthy and difficult hospitalization, including heart surgery, medical paralytics, vocal cord paralysis, drug withdrawal, and development of oral aversion. As a result, he needed to learn how to eat again. Fortunately, we were able to lean on Ronald McDonald House to support us so we could stay close to our son during his most critical moments. The dinners at the house were an incredible reprieve after a stressful and grueling day alongside our son. We stayed in the Ronald McDonald House for the entire 56 days of his initial hospitalization. Brody was hospitalized 11 times more within the following 18 months, and Ronald McDonald House continued to come to our aid again by offering us a Family Room on multiple occasions while at Children's Hospital of Richmond. We are so grateful for their support during the most difficult time of our lives. Brody is now 8 years old and thriving. Ronald McDonald House was truly a blessing to us during this most difficult time and we are thankful for their mission to "keep families close."
