This promise isn't just for the future—it's for today. Our past mistakes and regrets do not define us. In Christ, we have forgiveness, hope, and a new identity.

I love my Lutheran faith and want to share its beauty and depth with you. Our liturgy, shaped over centuries, connects us to generations of believers. Its roots reach back to the early church and were preserved and reformed during the 16th century by Martin Luther, who emphasized worship centered on Scripture, the Sacraments, and the Gospel.

One of the most cherished parts of our service is the *Nunc Dimittis*, drawn from Luke 2:29–32. This Latin phrase means "Now let your servant depart in peace." God had promised Simeon that he would not die until he had seen God's salvation. These words were first spoken by Simeon when he saw the infant Jesus in the temple, rejoicing that God had fulfilled His promise of salvation.

In our worship, the *Nunc Dimittis* is traditionally sung after receiving Holy Communion, expressing that we too have seen Christ—truly present in, with, and under the bread and wine as His body and blood, offering forgiveness and salvation. In that moment, we join Simeon and countless believers throughout history in rejoicing that our eyes have seen God's salvation.

When we worship, we join a timeless chorus of praise that spans centuries and unites us with the Holy Christian church globally and eternally.

Operation Christmas Child Update

Thank you to the many members and friends of Prince of Peace who have supported the Shoebox Ministry in the past. In 2025, we were blessed to deliver 120 boxes to the collection center--boxes full of school supplies, hygiene items and **FUN items, like stuffed animals, musical instruments, dolls, cars and trucks.**

Our boxes traveled to two South African countries this past year—Tanzania and South Africa. Tanzania, officially the United Republic of Tanzania, is a country in East Africa within the African Great Lakes region. Tanzania's population comprises about 120 ethnic, linguistic, and religious groups. Christianity is the largest religion in Tanzania, with substantial Muslim and Animist minorities. South Africa, officially the Republic of South Africa (RSA), is the southernmost country in Africa. South Africa encompasses a variety of cultures, languages, and religions, and has been called the "rainbow nation", especially in the wake of apartheid, to describe its diversity. Since the end of apartheid, government accountability and quality of life have substantially improved for non-white citizens.



Please continue to pray that the Holy Spirit will touch the hearts of the children who received the boxes and participate in the Greatest Journey discipleship course.



Mite Explanation and History

Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" — offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars that fund district and national [mission grants](#) and implement the LWML program.

[Mite Boxes](#), available from the district, zone, or LWML office, are distributed to every woman in a society, and often to each member of the congregation. Local groups submit Mite Box offerings to the appointed district officer.

The Widow's Mite


Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty, put in everything — all she had to live on" ([Mark 12:41–43](#)).

- Put your pennies in the box at the end of each day
- Say "thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or misfortune has been averted
- Empty all your loose change from your kitchen coin bowl into the box on meeting day

Throughout the decades, Lutheran women have stepped out in faith, setting goals and trusting God to move the hearts of His people to give generously to LWML to proclaim the Gospel.






